


Chain Mail Protective Gloves



Instructions for use

Read carefully before use

Statement

This instruction for use is intended for supervisors and users of chain mail protective gloves. If you have any questions, please contact the manufacturer or your local distributor.

Chain mail protective gloves can not withstand the force of power-driven blades, knives, saws and other similar tools. Chain mail protective gloves could be caught in moving machinery and should not be used where such contact is possible.

Areas of use

Chain mail protective gloves have been designed and manufactured to provide some protection against cuts and stabs injuries for work where a knife is moved towards the user's hand and forearm, especially when working with hand knives in slaughterhouses, in large scale catering establishments, and in manual boning-out operations to process meat, game and poultry. Protective gloves against stabs may also offer adequate protection for those working with hand knives in the plastics, leather and textile and paper industries, when laying flooring and similar tasks.

Safety instructions / Warning

The following safety measures should be observed when using chain mail protective gloves:

1. Read these instructions carefully before use and observe them in every respect. The supervisor should make sure that the user has fully understood these instructions for use.
2. Every day before use check that the gloves are in perfect condition.
3. If you find any defect on the gloves, report it to the supervisor at once.
4. The supervisor should ensure that the defective gloves are replaced immediately.
5. In no circumstances must these gloves be modified.
6. These gloves will conduct electricity and should not be worn near the electrical appliances or equipments.
7. These gloves will only protect against cuts and other injuries caused by hand knives or manual cutting equipments.

8. You must clean the gloves following the method exactly as described in these instructions.

Instruction for selection and wearing

1. The glove size specified must be the correct size for the user's hands. The gloves should fit the hands perfectly allowing sufficient freedom of movement for the fingers. It should not be too tight, a little larger is better. (Please see the following table - gloves sizes and type)

Glove type and size

Type	Size	Straps Color
Five Finger Glove	XXS	Brown

2. The cuff size specified must be the correct size for the user's forearm and be appropriate for the degree of protection required. Gloves are

available without cuffs, with cuffs (forearm protection) and with sleeves (protection up to the shoulder). When put the glove on the hand, please slide the buckle position according to your wrist circumference until you think it is befitting. After a glove has been fitted to a user and the straps correctly adjusted, then trailing ends of the wrist strap or straps beyond the buckle should be cut off if they are longer than 25mm.

3. A chain mail glove is inelastic and so gloves are usually chosen by user so that they are big enough to prevent any dimension becoming too tight during use. Both the width and the length have to fit properly because the chain mail allows little dimensional change to compensate for inadequate length or width, the gloves does not restrict the hand movements associated with the work, some allowances to these dimensions will be necessary.

Care and maintain

1. To ensure optimum protection, gloves should be kept in perfect condition for use.

2. Use the correct amount of cleaning products and disinfectant to ensure that fabric and plastic straps do not deteriorate prematurely.

3. It is important to keep a sufficient number of gloves permanently in stock to ensure that they are available at all times.

4. Only the manufacturer or a specialist approved by the manufacturer is authorized to repair these gloves.

5. Any glove showing signs of abnormal wear or missing ring or rings must be replaced immediately by a glove in good condition. Only the manufacturer is authorized to repair defective gloves or to declare a glove beyond repair.

Cleaning and storage

1. At least once a day gloves should be scrubbed vigorously in hot soapy water (50 °C) or in a mixture of hot water (50 °C) and detergent. They can also be cleaned in a washing machine.

2. After washing, the gloves should be rinsed in water at a minimum temperature of 82 °C To disinfect them, use only products approved by the food safety authorities.

3. After cleaning, store the gloves in a cool, dry and well ventilated place.

4. Do not clean chain mail protective gloves and metal chain mail protective gloves by knocking them against a hard surface.

5. Please pay more attention to certain cases which can cause the damage of gloves or reduce the protective performance, special chemical substances, such as acid, cleaning agents, detergents ,alkalis, aging, excessive wear and environmental factors.

Recommendations

Gloves have been designed and made in conformity with European Standard EN 1082-1. They have been designed to be used in normal working conditions. Do not use knives with a blade measuring less than 12.5mm in width at a point 20mm from the tip.

Guarantees and limits of liability

Claims regarding defective products must be made within 5 days of receipt the goods. The manufacturer's guarantee is limited solely to the replacement of refund of the purchase price of the defective product. The manufacturer accepts no liability for gloves not repaired in its own workshops. No guarantee can be given in the manufacture's stead or place. Any guarantee other than those indicated above is excluded by the manufacturer, particularly in the event of misuse or not in conformity with instructions. (See instructions for use)
